**CITY HALL OF FAME PROGRAM
CRITERIA/GUIDELINES**

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1. PURPOSE AND SCOPE

1.1 Purpose

The City of Moreno Valley City Hall of Fame (“Hall of Fame”) recognizes individuals, groups, and organizations whose leadership, service, or achievements have made a **significant and lasting contribution** to the City of Moreno Valley and its residents. The program preserves the City’s history, celebrates excellence, and strengthens civic pride.

1.2 Scope

The Hall of Fame honors contributions across civic, cultural, economic, educational, and community disciplines. Honorees may be living or deceased and may include residents, former residents, or individuals whose work substantially benefited the City of Moreno Valley.

2. MISSION STATEMENT

The mission of the City Hall of Fame is to honor individuals, groups, and organizations whose achievements, leadership, or service demonstrate exceptional merit and have produced a lasting positive impact on the City of Moreno Valley and its community.

3. INDUCTION CATEGORIES

Inductions may be made within the following categories:

- ~~Civic Leadership and Public Service~~
- ~~Community Service and Volunteerism~~
- ~~Arts, Culture, and Entertainment~~

- ~~Business, Industry, and Economic Development~~
- ~~Education and Youth Development~~
- ~~Public Safety and Military Service~~
- ~~Sports and Athletics~~
- ~~Lifetime Achievement~~
- ~~Special Recognition / Local Legacy~~

- **Civic Leadership and Public Service**

Recognizes individuals who have demonstrated outstanding leadership in government, public administration, or civic organizations. Honorees in this category have significantly influenced public policy, community planning, or civic advancement through elected or appointed office, advocacy, or sustained public leadership that improved the quality of life in the community.

- **Community Service and Volunteerism**

Honors individuals who have made exceptional contributions through volunteer efforts, charitable work, nonprofit leadership, or grassroots initiatives. Nominees in this category demonstrate sustained commitment to serving others and have created measurable, positive impact within the community without primary financial compensation.

- **Arts, Culture, and Entertainment**

Recognizes individuals who have enriched the community through achievements in visual arts, performing arts, literature, music, film, cultural preservation, or entertainment. Honorees have demonstrated excellence, creativity, and influence that elevates community identity, cultural awareness, or artistic reputation at the local, regional, or national level.

- **Business, Industry, and Economic Development**

Honors individuals who have significantly contributed to economic growth, job creation, entrepreneurship, innovation, or industry leadership. Nominees may include founders, executives, or professionals whose work strengthened the local economy, fostered business development, or enhanced the community's economic sustainability and reputation.

- **Education and Youth Development**

Recognizes educators, administrators, mentors, coaches, or advocates who have made

substantial contributions to academic achievement, youth leadership, character development, or lifelong learning. Honorees in this category demonstrate measurable and lasting impact on students and young people.

- **Public Safety and Military Service**

Honors individuals who have demonstrated exceptional service in law enforcement, fire services, emergency response, or military service. Recognition may be based on valor, leadership, sustained service, or extraordinary contributions that enhanced safety, security, or national defense while reflecting positively on the community.

- **Sports and Athletics**

Recognizes individuals who have achieved excellence in athletic performance, coaching, sports administration, or athletic leadership. Honorees have demonstrated outstanding accomplishment, sportsmanship, and positive representation of the community at competitive levels.

- **Lifetime Achievement/Special Recognition**

Honors individuals, families, or organizations whose contributions have left a meaningful, lasting, and transformative imprint on the community's identity, heritage, and overall development. This recognition celebrates a sustained body of work demonstrating long-term excellence, leadership, and impact across one or more areas of civic, cultural, economic, or social life. This designation may also recognize extraordinary singular acts of significance or unique contributions that do not fall neatly within other categories but have permanently shaped the character, reputation, or historical narrative of the community. Posthumous recognition is appropriate within this category.

Categories may be reviewed and updated periodically to reflect community priorities.

4. Standards of Conduct

Induction into the Hall of Fame is reserved for individuals whose achievements are accompanied by conduct that reflects positively on the City of Moreno Valley. Nominees must demonstrate a consistent pattern of character, integrity, and ethical behavior throughout their personal and professional lives.

Character is reflected in the nominee's demonstrated pattern of responsibility, respect for others, and positive contributions to the community over time.

Integrity requires adherence to strong moral and ethical principles, including accountability, fairness, and consistency between words and actions.

Honesty includes truthfulness, transparency, and avoidance of deception or misrepresentation in personal, professional, and public matters.

A nominee's moral code should be evidenced by lawful conduct, respect for community standards, and decisions that reflect responsibility and good judgment. Evaluation shall focus on documented behavior and actions rather than personal beliefs or viewpoints.

Educational background, professional credentials, or formal training may support a nominee's qualifications but shall not substitute for demonstrated impact, service, and ethical conduct.

5. DIVERSITY, EQUITY, AND INCLUSION

The City of Moreno Valley is committed to an inclusive and equitable Hall of Fame process. Nominations and selections shall be made without discrimination based on race, ethnicity, national origin, gender, age, religion, disability, sexual orientation, or socioeconomic status.

Active outreach shall be encouraged to ensure representation of historically underrecognized individuals, communities, and contributions that reflect the full diversity of Moreno Valley.

6. ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

6.1 Time Requirement

- Living nominees must have resided in, worked in, or provided substantial service to the City of Moreno Valley for a minimum of **five (5) years**.
- Nominees must have completed the body of work or achievement for which they are being recognized prior to nomination.

- Posthumous nominees must have been deceased for a minimum of **one (1) year**.

6.2 Minimum Participation or Contribution

Nominees must demonstrate either:

- Sustained involvement or service with meaningful impact on the City, or
- A singular achievement of exceptional significance that resulted in long-term community benefit.

6.3 Ineligibility

- Currently elected City officials are not eligible while serving in office.
- City employees directly administering the Hall of Fame program are not eligible during employment.

7. SELECTION CRITERIA

Nominees are evaluated based on:

- ~~1. Impact on the City of Moreno Valley and its residents~~
- ~~2. Longevity, consistency, and significance of contributions~~
- ~~3. Leadership, integrity, and ethical conduct~~
- ~~4. Advancement of community pride or quality of life~~
- ~~5. Alignment with the mission and values of the Hall of Fame~~

- ***Impact on the City of Moreno Valley and its Residents***

Refers to the measurable and meaningful effect an individual's actions, leadership, or achievements have had on the City of Moreno Valley and its residents. Impact may be demonstrated through improved services, expanded opportunities, economic growth, cultural enrichment, enhanced public safety, or other tangible benefits that positively influenced the community at large or a defined population within the city.

- ***Longevity, Consistency, and Significance of Contributions***

Evaluates the duration, reliability, and overall importance of the nominee's contributions. This includes sustained involvement over time, consistent demonstration of excellence or service, and the degree to which the contributions produced substantial and lasting results rather than short-term or isolated achievements.

- ***Leadership, Integrity, and Ethical Conduct***

Assesses the nominee's character and example within the community. Leadership includes the ability to inspire, guide, or positively influence others. Integrity and ethical conduct refer to adherence to moral principles, honesty, accountability, and behavior that reflects positively on the City of Moreno Valley. Nominees should demonstrate conduct that upholds community standards and public trust.

- ***Advancement of Community Pride or Quality of Life***

Measures on how the nominee's accomplishments have enhanced civic pride, strengthened community identity, improved public well-being, or elevated Moreno Valley's reputation locally, regionally, or nationally. This may include contributions that foster unity, cultural appreciation, youth development, public engagement, or improved living conditions.

- ***Alignment with the Mission and Values of the Hall of Fame***

Determines whether the nominee's achievements and conduct reflect the stated purpose, guiding principles, and standards of the Hall of Fame. Recognition should reinforce the Hall's commitment to honoring excellence, service, integrity, and meaningful contributions that positively shape the City of Moreno Valley.

8. NOMINATION PROCESS

8.1 Public Call for Nominations

Nominations are solicited annually through City communication channels.

8.2 Submission Requirements

Each nomination must include:

- A completed official nomination form
- A written narrative describing the nominee's qualifications and impact
- Supporting documentation such as letters of support, media coverage, or testimonials
- *Self-nominations shall not be accepted

8.3 Administrative Review

City staff review submissions for eligibility and completeness. Incomplete or ineligible nominations do not advance.

8.4 Nomination Duration

Eligible nominations remain active for **three (3) years** and may be reconsidered without resubmission.

9. SELECTION PROCESS

9.1 Selection Committee

A Hall of Fame Selection Committee comprised of:

- *EHPC,*
- ~~City appointed members and community representatives evaluates nominations.~~
- City staff provide administrative support.

9.2 Voting

- ~~Confidential ballot voting~~
- *Group discussion amongst the EHPC to determine the final inductees*
- **Two-thirds (2/3) majority vote (3/5)** required for induction
- Committee may select fewer than the maximum number of inductees or none if standards are not met

9.3 Annual Induction Limit

No more than ~~nine (9)~~ **eight (8)** inductees may be selected per year unless otherwise authorized.

10. CRITERIA FOR REMOVAL

- *Any behavior deemed inappropriate by the EPHC or City Council*
- *False information on application/not subject to appeal*
- *Violation of city policies and regulations*
- *Convicted of moral turpitude*
- *Felony charges and criminal convictions that were not previously disclosed*

10. RECOGNITION AND INDUCTION

Inductees are formally recognized through:

- A City-sponsored induction ceremony
- Plaques, certificates, or permanent displays
- Inclusion in a digital or physical Hall of Fame archive

11. ADMINISTRATION AND OVERSIGHT

The Hall of Fame program is administered by The Environmental and Historical Preservation Commission or other designated City staff, with oversight consistent with City policies. Procedures may be reviewed periodically for effectiveness and transparency.

12. AMENDMENTS

These guidelines may be amended administratively or by City Council direction and shall apply prospectively.
